The Hemet San Jacinto Congress of Republicans is privileged to have Derek Kinnison, a Jan. 6 pardon, as the guest speaker at the March 31 General Membership Meeting.

This is an opportunity for members of the **HSJCR** to hear the facts of January 6 firsthand and to hear firsthand about the treatment he received as a defendant.

Derek was one of four men from Riverside County who were sentenced to prison after being convicted of conspiracy to obstruct an official proceeding and other charges during the January 6, 2021, breach of the U.S. Capitol. **Derek's** prison term was 33 months and to pay \$2000 in restitution. **Mr. Kinnison** was sentenced to prison in April, 2024. — a political maneuver!

One of the first acts of **President Donald J. Trump** was to commute the terms of **Derek** and 1500 January 6 defendants.

This promises to be an informative, interesting, and enlightening meeting.
